FY22 Budget Process



- On Wednesday, June 16, the new City Council was briefed on the upcoming FY 2022 budget and proposed American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) priorities
- City is finalizing General Fund revenue projections as more information becomes available (e.g., property tax valuations which make up 57% of sources)
- The City Manager's recommended balanced biennial budget will be published on August 6 and briefed to Council on August 10



Budget – Proposed Use of ARPA funds



- City of Dallas will receive \$355.4M from American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Local Fiscal Recovery Funds for spending through 2024
- Proposed plan has 86% dedicated to infrastructure, health & safety, and fiscal recovery to replace lost revenue
- \$48M (14%) is dedicated to economic development/getting residents and businesses back to work
 - Support people in crisis by providing targeted and equitable workforce development, mental health care, food/essentials assistance, etc. – \$32M
 - Provide City Council District funding for relief to small businesses, nonprofits, or impacted industries based on established criteria – \$16M





- City conducted three Tele-Town Hall Meetings from May 24-25 on the upcoming FY 2022 budget and reached more than 17K residents
- During Q&A, residents expressed:
 - Need for help with home repairs, small jobs like yard work or tree trimming, rental and housing assistance, and employment services
 - Concerns about street and alley conditions, property taxes, garbage and bulk/brush pickup, 911 wait times, and neighbors experiencing homelessness
 - Support for parks, library programs, Comprehensive Environmental and Climate Action Plan (CECAP), and recreational programs, especially for children and teens
- In addition to TTHMs, staff launched informal annual survey about programs and services residents value most
- Survey will run online from June 2-23 at bit.ly/2SQWnkW

Culture of Value Background



- During the summer of 2020, staff and Commission worked to create a funding program in response to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Objective: to support Dallas artists and organizations' projects centered around an ALAANA culture or experience that furthered the "Culture of Value" that the arts are essential to a thriving, equitable society within the city of Dallas (Cultural Plan, Support for Artists Priority - Strategy 14)
- Culture of Value allowed OAC to simultaneously provide services for the residents of Dallas during a time of decreased access to arts programming and provide financial support for ALAANA artists
- Awarded \$208,860 from Arts Endowment Fund to 71 ALAANA artists and organizations (46% new to OAC)

Select Project Highlights

Teatro Flor Candela MASCARA al MIO CARDIO: A Street Show (Community Involvement Theater)

Street procession starting in a Jefferson Boulevard supermarket parking lot that incorporated people walking on the street or waiting at a bus stop to play a part in the show.

Participants were asked to share how the past year has affected them and the actors would improvise an interpretation.

In response to Culture of Value: "The power of art belongs to every human being, because in every man, every woman, every girl in every child lives an intra-hero artist with the capacity to respond to anything that happens to him in life."





Select Project Highlights



Lucina Montanez Mota: Bizuteria Artesenal (Jewelry Making) (Spanish language programming – Culturally Centered Arts)

Lucina created a series of Spanish language jewelry-making workshops in her backyard in the Pleasant Grove neighborhood. Participants were women from the surrounding area. They learned about the cultural significance of the pieces that Lucina makes, and created necklaces, earrings, and bracelets that mixed in their own cultural backgrounds.

Culture of Value was the first time Lucina applied for funding with OAC. She has since received funding through ArtsActivate 2021 and through Community Arts.










Percent Events per Typology

Impact



- 71 applicants funded; all ALAANA
 - 52 artists (73%)
 - 19 organizations (27%)
- Leveraged \$41K in other sources of revenue
- Artist fees accounted for 55% of all expenses (~\$131K)

Key Learnings



- Pared down and simplified application process
 - Expanded access to application process to new artists
 - Asking questions very specifically relevant to the scoring process
 - Removing superfluous and "carry-over" questions and requirements
 - Laid groundwork to do the same in ArtsActivate
- Spanish language application/resources
 - Expanded access to new artists
 - Gave a good foundation for expanding into ArtsActivate applications
 - Barriers still exist in other departments which do not have Spanish language materials/resources
 - Accounts Payable; Procurement; Attorneys


FY 2020-21 COP Mid-Year Update

- In March 2021, a check-in survey was conducted with COP orgs to measure changes in events and attendance benchmarks.
- All of the current COP organizations have continued operations and continued providing services in spite of all the COVID-era challenges
- Programming has continued to evolve in terms of in-person vs. virtual programming as COVID public health trends have evolved
- Reported trends are showing a return to more in-person centered programming



Events






Attendance

Next Steps – COP 2021-22 year:

- Application closed on Monday, June 14, with 52 applications submitted (16 new!)
- Commission will vote on funding allocation in August or September 2021
- No anticipated budget cuts for FY 2021-22 COP
- Contract revisions
 - Scopes of services seasonal events benchmarks reintroduced
 - Virtual programming definitions
 - Commission liaison roles and responsibilities more formalized as ex-officio board members
 - Removal of audit/financial reporting requirements for orgs <\$500K revenue without long-term OAC contracts

Poet Laureate – Background Info



- OAC funds about 6-7 different literary-focused arts organizations and artists each year
- Dallas Public Library has offered a Youth Poetry Competition for 25 years
- The 2018 Cultural Plan helped grow awareness and appreciation for Dallas' literary arts scene
 - In 2018, more than 70 people showed up for the Cultural Plan literary arts meeting held at Wild Detectives
 - Support for Artists Priority, Strategy #14: Develop a "Culture of Value" establishing the arts as essential to a thriving, equitable society within the City of Dallas specifically mentions a poet laureate



Poet Laureate



- The City of Dallas Poet Laureate is a three-way partnership between OAC, the Dallas Public Library and Deep Vellum Publishing
- Both the City of Houston and the City of Los Angeles generously shared their lessons learned with us to help scope this project
- Key goals are that the selected poet will:
 - Hold office hours at the Central Library and conduct events and workshops across Dallas
 - Engage with communities across Dallas
 - Help nurture the literary community in our city

Poet Laureate - Guidelines

- Applications opened June 1 and will close December 31, 2021
- Candidates must have published 10 works in established publications over the past five years
- The position is a paid position \$20,000 in three payments over two years
- Deep Vellum has committed to publish a full-length volume (~60 pages) of the poet laureate's work

OAC Team Growth and Transitions:



- Coming out of a year of hiring freezes, furloughs and reassignments, and two major dark venues, OAC is working to round out our team
- Additionally, we lost six full-time people to attrition and retirements over the past 15 months
- After 25 years of dedicated service and leadership, David Fisher is retiring effective June 25
