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Commission Annual Report



- Section 8-1.1 of City Code requires each Commission to submit an Annual Report, due each year by February 1. These reports typically summarize all official Commission activities in the previous fiscal year
- OAC has drafted the report for FY 2020-21; this draft was sent via email today
 - Analysis of final performance metric (number of people served) will take place in December, with an update and reminder email sent in early January
- Report will be a voting item for approval at the January Commission meeting
- As per the Rules of Procedure, Commissioners may submit revisions to the draft either:
 - During the regular November Commission meeting (today), OR
 - In writing to OAC staff at least five business days prior to the regular January meeting – i.e., submit written revisions by <u>January 12, 2022</u>
- If a Commissioner wishes to add a dissenting report, that option is also available

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National Endowment for the Arts



- In June 2021, the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) announced two grant programs to distribute approximately \$80M in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to help supplement relief and recovery of the arts and culture sector
 - \$20M was available for local arts agencies for subgranting
 - \$60M was available to arts and culture organizations
- OAC applied for \$250K of funding for the Culture of Value grant program, which was a pilot relief and project mini-grant program begun in 2020 for ALAANA artists and organizations
- Last week, OAC received notification that the full project funding of \$250K has been recommended for award, pending final NEA review
- Will be largest NEA award ever received by City of Dallas/OAC



Recap: Culture of Value




- During the summer of 2020, staff and Commission worked to create a funding program in response to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Objective: to support Dallas ALAANA artists and organizations that furthered the "Culture of Value" that the arts are essential to a thriving, equitable society within the city of Dallas (Cultural Plan, Support for Artists Priority Strategy 14)
- Culture of Value provided both services for the residents of Dallas during a time of decreased access to arts programming and financial support to ALAANA artists
- Awarded \$208,860 from Arts Endowment Fund to 71 ALAANA artists and organizations (46% new to OAC)
- First time OAC process was re-engineered for Spanish language applications



Impact and Learnings

- Pared down and simplified application process and robust community engagement before and during application period led to success
- 71 applicants funded
- 100% ALAANA with a maximum award of \$3K
 - 52 artists (73%), 19 organizations (27%)
- Artist fees accounted for 55% of all expenses (~\$131K)
- Timing from application close to notice was 26 days





Next Steps



- Awards were announced by NEA and the City of Dallas this morning see links for <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u> press releases
- Final award notification from NEA notification is still pending
- City Council acceptance projected for January 2022 funds will "last" until November 2023
- Anticipated community outreach in May 2022 to finalize grants program guidelines
- Anticipated application periods in Summer 2022 and Summer 2023
